


LAFFANOUR | GALERIE DOWNTOWN AT MAZE ART GSTAAD 2025

The subtle scenography invites collectors and lovers of art and design to enjoy a unique experience, unveiling works that are both emblematic and timeless. One of the highlights is an iconic porthole by **Jean Prouvé**, designed in the 1950s and reflecting his visionary approach to architectural design.

Iconic pieces by Roger Capron, along with the artistic explorations of Vassilakis Takis and Richard Texier, will engage in a dialogue with contemporary works by Thomas Ruff. An exceptional pequi wood coffee table, designed by the Brazilian master José Zanine Caldas, and emblematic creations of Shaker furniture will further enrich this selection. Together, they reflect a commitment to fostering a conversation between historical heritage and modernity, meeting the expectations of an audience seeking authentic artistic experiences.

Laffanour | Galerie Downtown also holds the archives of Galerie Steph Simon, which from 1956 to 1974 represented and published furniture by Charlotte Perriand, Jean Prouvé, Serge Mouille, Georges Jouve and Isamu Noguchi.
